	The data subject has the right to withdraw their consent at any time without this affecting the lawfulness of the processing carried out prior to this withdrawal, if the processing of personal data is based on the consent of the data subject.
	Upon request, the data subject may use the Diaconia University of Applied Sciences' own model form.

The data subject has the right to file a complaint with the Office of the Data Protection Ombudsman.
<ul> <li>Profiling is not carried out on the basis of personal data contained in the register.</li> <li>The purpose of profiling is to follow the student's academic success and, for example, to prevent interruption of a student's studies and help them to complete their degree.</li> <li>If personal data is processed for direct marketing purposes, the data subject has the right at any time to oppose the processing of their personal data for such marketing, including profiling when it is related to such direct marketing.</li> <li>The data protection officer is the contact person in matters relating to the rights and obligations of the data subjects. The contact details of the data protection officer are given at the beginning of the privacy statement (section 2).</li> </ul>
