# BACHELOR OF HEALTH CARE, DIACONAL NURSE

#### **CURRICULUM 2020**

The curriculum fulfils the Act (559/1994 and 1200/2007), Decree (564/1994) and EU directives (updated 2013/55/EU) on health care professionals as well as nationally agreed competence requirements of registered nurse education (2019).

The degree includes at least 90 credits of theological studies and vocational studies related to parish and church work as referred to in the decision by the General Synod on 24 January 2017 (Church statutes no. 124). The degree gives the competence required from those who hold the office of a deacon at the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Finland and an office-holder (deaconess) who carries out diaconal work as their main task.
